  - i. Introduction
  - ii. Keeping the Peace Poster (Feedback from entire Senate)
    - 1. Don't ignore conflict
    - 2. Don't exaggerate conflict
    - 3. Don't abandon conflict
    - 4. Don't force yourself in a conflict
    - 5. Don't recycle conflict
      - a. Brain storm problems/conflicts within clubs and senate
        - Communication, gossip, dishonesty, taking things personally, taking or not taking responsibility,
  - iii. Giving Feedback
    - 1. Positive vs. Constructive feedback
      - a. Be specific-talk about behaviors
        - i. Give examples
      - b. Watch tone of voice
      - c. Speak for yourself, not others
        - i. Use 'I' statements
          - 1. Examples of 'I' statements
      - d. Do not overload person with a lot of feedback
      - e. Timing/ state of mind
      - f. Ask yourself is this helpful or harmful
        - i. Is it for me or them?
      - g. Start with positive feedback then constructive
        - i. Turned to each other and gave positive feedback
    - 2. Receiving Feedback –give examples
      - a. Use nonverbal communication to show you are listening
      - b. Limit your response to thank you
